MYP INTERNATIONAL ENGLISH G2

THIS COURSE IS FOR:

Students whose English is NOT native or near native speaker in proficiency level who are aiming to improve their English so that they can study IB English B. A few students who demonstrate advanced levels of English at the end of this course, and who have excellent reading and academic writing skills, may be able to select English A.

EXTERNAL PROGRAMMES –

The following programmes and assessment methods are used to develop this course:

MYP Language A, IGCSE English as a Second Language

COURSE DURATION: 1 year (2 semesters)

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

To enable students to:

- 1. communicate effectively in English in practical and formal settings (daily conversations as well as formal speeches and interviews)
- 2. write a variety of text types such as summaries, note-taking, personal and formal letters, literary essays and persuasive writing
- 3. read for general meaning and for specific information
- 4. read for pleasure, understanding and knowledge
- 5. listen for main ideas and specific details
- 6. speak accurately and fluently about general interest issues in a conversational context
- 7. reflect on and set goals to improve their own learning styles and achievement

THEMES/TOPICS - MAIN LEARNING FOCUS
