This written assignment is in two parts:

Part A: Rationale (150-250 words)

Use this part to introduce your answer and explain how you intend to achieve your aims. You must include the following:

- briefly introduce your literary work
- identify your subject
- state your aims
- explain how you intend to achieve these aims through your selection of details, choice of audience, text type, register and style.

Part B: Response 500-600 words

Here, using your own words, you write a **creative response** to the subject of the novel that interests you. Note that you **must** make clear and effective **connections** with details from the text. It is suggested that you focus on an important moment or experience in the novel in your creative response. Also, choose a narrator from whose perspective you will write your text. Remember that you **must not invent details**, but rather use details from the text creatively. You may include illustrations, but artistic merit will not be assessed.

Text Type:

Use a suitable text type from your HL text list to write a creative response. You **must not** write an essay.

Process:

The Written Assignment is written in your own time, although you may be given some class time as well. It is the responsibility of your teacher to give you guidance and verbal feedback at different stages of your work. Your teacher is also responsible for ensuring that your answer is your own work.

Timetable

Stage	Due Date
1. Brainstorm potential subjects and then select your best one. Also, decide on a narrative viewpoint and audience for your new text. Write an empathetic literary research question for your subject. Meet with your teacher to discuss your question, narrative viewpoint. and audience.	
2. Search your novel for chapters, sections or pages relevant to your subject. Record relevant details on the note-making sheet you have been given. Meet with your teacher to discuss the source details you will be using and to receive approval to begin a draft copy of your answer.	

3. Write, revise and proof read your draft copy and submit a hard copy to your teacher. Before submission, self check your draft against the rubric and checklist that is below. You will now receive final oral feedback from your teacher.	
4. Use the feedback you have received to revise and prepare a final copy of your answer. Submit a copy through Turnitin as well as a hardcopy to your teacher.	

Checklist

1. Look at the attached summary of the criterion **before you begin** planning your answer.
2. Provide an accurate word count at the bottom of both your rationale and response.
3. Number each page, place your rationale before your response and provide a heading for both sections.
4. Reference your novel using MLA format at the bottom of your response. Use Easybib.
5. **After** you have completed your rationale and response check whether you have **achieved the criteria** by ticking one of the columns beside the criteria.
